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Athree-ply cord is not easily broken. Eccl 4:12b

Some years ago, I travelled to Yosemite National Park while visiting friends in California's Central Valley. The natural beauty of the park's peaks, valleys, and waterfalls were truly breathtaking, but there was another natural wonder that I went seeking: the Giant Sequoias. Not only are they the largest species of trees, but they are among the largest and oldest living organisms in the world. These majestic trees can live for thousands of years, growing on average 200–300 ft tall with a diameter of 25 ft. The largest tree in the world, General Sherman weighs over 2.7 million pounds, has a circumference of 102 ft at the base, has a height of 275 ft (rivalling a 26-story building), and is 2500 years old!

The Giant Sequoias are certainly impressive and represent incredible strength, but there is one fact that shocked me. Though

they soar into the heights, their roots are small and surprisingly shallow, only going 6-20 ft deep. How is it that these massive trees do not topple with Mother Nature's fierce winds and violent squalls? The answer may surprise you as it did me – these giants grow in close proximity to each other, and their roots are intertwined in an impressive network providing strength and stability. Even General Sherman would buckle if the neighboring trees were chopped down. The trees are stronger together.

That natural network of roots reminds me of what makes our community so strong. Through the years, we have weathered storms together, and we are still standing because of the countless men and women supporting one another. The St. Jude of the Lake Church and School community is growing thanks to the commitment of individuals like you, and we do not plan to go away anytime soon. One of my favorite Scripture verses that reflects the necessity of community is from the Book of Ecclesiastes: "Where one alone may be overcome, two together can resist. A three-ply cord is not easily broken" (Eccl 4:12). If you have not checked out our school lately, I invite you to take a tour. And if you have not experienced the community that is growing in our church, I invite you to come and see what Jesus is doing. We need each other, and

Strategic Plan Initiatives for 2022-2023

WE HAVE A STRATEGIC PLAN That is a working and always evolving document. The current strategies and action steps we are concentrating our efforts on are listed below.

EXPAND MARKETING EFFORTS AND ENROLLMENT STRATEGIES TO INCREASE AND RETAIN ENROLLMENT.

We have implemented the Penguin Power campaign, increased our visibility in print and social media, and made great strides in building our relationship with St. Jude of the Lake Discovery Center.

IDENTIFY CONSISTENT MEANS OF FUNDING FOR PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT AND PROVIDE PROGRESS REPORTS.

Future funding ideas are a crucial part of the business plan shared with all potential donors. A deliberate effort is being made to provide all our stakeholders and families with up-to-date information that is going on in our school. We are currently working on growing our school endowment fund.

USE ASSESSMENT DATA IN A CONSISTENT MANNER TO GUIDE CURRICULUM AND INSTRUCTION DECISIONS.

We are more deliberate in our communication with students and parents on state- wide standards, curriculum and strategies. We are using, several different methods of assessment to help us better serve our students needs with and to help create their personalized learning plans. These efforts include better use of technology, collaboration with other teachers and a variety of hands-on assessment tools.

DEVELOP A SCHOOL-WIDE PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT PLAN.

As a staff, we are looking at and researching a variety of professional development opportunities in the areas of reading, math and science. We have implemented a Staff Development Series each month to introduce and facilitate innovative and engaging ideas that the staff takes ownership of and is excited about. This year we sent staff to the ISTE Conference in New Orleans, Lego League Challenge Event, and Orton-Gillingham and Dyslexia Training here in the Twin Cities.

INVESTIGATE DIFFERENT AND SUSTAINABLE FUNDING MODELS TO SUPPORT EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS.

We are being very diligent and aggressive in fundraising and our school endowment efforts. We have a team of enthusiasts identified and who are willing to help cast out our net and build up financial sustainability.




















Middle School Renovation

OUR DAYS AT ST. JUDE OF THE LAKE Catholic School are designed to inspire, engage, and educate everyone as we live our journey as lifelong learners together. Our hands-on faith-based curriculum incorporates Word Of Life Religion, Rua Woods Theology of the Body, literacy skills, SuperKids, Reading Side By Side, language arts, handwriting, Envision math, FOSS Science Next Generation, STEM, and TCI Social Studies. Also new this year is an on-site school counselor from the Phoenix Institute. This amazing resource is provided through a Catholic School of Excellence Grant titled, Peace of Mind. Not only does the grant forward us this opportunity but also provided staff development and parent education monthly videos and on-site presentations. Our Middle School students are still enjoying the Amplify ELA curriculum and Northern Lights Series from the Minnesota Historical Society. Students also take part in Mass, Library, Technology, Art, Music, Physical Education and Spanish classes weekly. Technology plays a vital role in our students learning experience through iPads, SMART boards, Apple TVs, plenty of coding opportunities, STEM challenges, and 3-D printing options. In combination with our amazing staff, we also have student support staff to assist with reinforcing concepts and skills at their level and pace. Sprinkle all that with service learning, Lego robotics, the LINKs Program (Life Involves New Kinds of Skills), Engineering Is Elementary, and an outdoor classroom... Once the eggs are ready, the students take a trip over to Browns Creek in Stillwater Minnesota for the big release. The students also participated in several cool field trips like putting waders on and collecting bugs in Browns Creek, snowshoeing and ice fishing on White Bear Lake, and learning how to make their own fishing lures.

On September 16, 2021, our students welcomed 75 tilapias to our Science Lab and have they grown-up since then! Currently the average size is around a pound and a half. The students have also planted a wide variety of plantings to grow in our in the raft gardens such as lettuce, beans, basil to name a few. We are also growing a variety of veggies upward in our vertical gardens. What do we do with the crop? We share with the Mahtomedi Food Shelf and our community!








ST. JUDE OF THE LAKE SERVE-A-THON 2022


The invitation is open to everyone. The warm feeling of paying it forward is felt by anyone that participates.

TEST SCORES STUDENTS AT ST. JUDE OF THE LAKE take the Northwest Evaluation Association's (NWEA) standardized tests, The Measure of Academic Progress (MAP). MAP tests are computer administered and scored achievement tests designed to measure growth in student learning for individual students, classrooms, and the school as a whole. Scores are reported in RIT units. This score represents a student's achievement level at any given moment and helps measure their academic growth over time. The RIT scale is a stable scale, like feet and inches, that accurately measures student performance, regardless of age, grades, or grade level. St. Jude of the Lake students' average scores in math, reading, and language usage are higher than the national average.

The student scores and norms presented are for Spring 2022. Thirty percent of our students scored at the 70th percentile or higher in language usage and seventy-four percent of our students scored at or above the 50th percentile. Thirty-four percent of our students scored at
